Bloomfield Road/W. IN-45, continue to follow W. Bloomfield Road. Twin Oaks Sports Park will be on the left side of road.

About the Program

All communities—urban, suburban, small town, rural—are experiencing growth and change, which has an impact on each community's environment. Whether you live in a city center, suburb, small town, or the countryside, your community is always changing.

Project Learning Tree's (PLT) new module, ***Exploring Environmental Issues : Places We Live***, addresses the various ways that community leaders can work together with citizens to manage the changes that accompany growth, thereby strengthening their sense of place.

Target Audience

This workshop will prepare participants to use the *Places We Live* with target audiences such as land use planners, community leaders, planning boards, developers, and local legislators. Participants will be introduced to the module, given an opportunity to try out a few activities, and explore ways to connect with these new adult audiences. The *Places We Live* can be utilized to help create a bond between citizens and their communities. The module leads participants through exploration of current and future community environmental issues, enabling them to make informed decisions about those issues.

Project Learning Tree

Project Learning Tree (PLT) is a program of the American Forest Foundation, supported in Indiana by the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry.

PLT uses the forest as a “window on the world” to increase students’ understanding of our complex environment, to stimulate critical and creative thinking, to develop the ability to make informed decisions on environmental issues, and to instill the confidence and commitment to take responsible action on behalf of the environment.
